4. OLD BUSINESS

A. Tropical Cyclone Hilary (August 19 & 20, 2023) and its impacts to BHMWC infrastructure. Notified of Federal Disaster Declaration on November 22, 2023 for Riverside County.

Director Ellis and Hutchinson reported that work is still taking place with FEMA to finalize damages and restoration funding. Delays due to the water flow in the canyon preventing access to our infrastructure.

- B. Update on Short-Term (Post Apple Fire) and Long-Term Flume Discussions & Milestones
 - 1. Repair work Phase 1A &1B

Director Ellis and Hutchinson provided updates to repair work on Phase 1A (South Fork to Raywood) will be concluding for 2024 season in October. SCE contractor is waiting for micropyle foundational structures to hold supports at BlackWheel Diversion and will be installing those 2025 season. All the anchors, aprons and erosion control requirements at the storm water crossings for 1A was completed this summer

Director Ellis and Hutchinson provided updates to repair work on Phase 1B (South Fork to East Fork) FERC review of the proposed restoration package (submitted June 2023) was stopped due to changes to the area due to Hurricane Hilary (2023). FERC requesting updated proposal based on new landscape of the area and road damage and destruction of the East Fork Diversion. Design and engineering under way by SCE to develop a new 1B restoration plan and package to submit to FERC. The South Fork Diversion structure will be overhauled in 1B as well.

2. Update on meeting with USFS, SCE and FERC Dispute Resolution Service – Road design

Director Ellis and Hutchinson provided updates to repair work on in-person meeting with USFS, SCE and FERC Dispute Resolution Service on September 5, 2024– Very productive and positive confidential settlement meeting. Discussion of full flume alignment plan, environmental requirements, East Fork Diversion and road restoration necessity and engineering, developing timelines, and necessity to get water direct to BHMWC.

3. Update on Gaging from SGPWA

Director Ellis and Hutchinson provided updates when the SGPWA board will be considering funding gaging at Raywood and Lower Burnt Canyon now that Burnt Canyon Diversion has been cleared of storm debris.

4. Update Burnt Canyon Diversion Storm Repairs

Director Romberg provided and update on Burnt Canyon Diversion Storm Repairs. The diversion structure has been cleared of boulders, rocks and dirt. The spur road has been cleared to access the diversion. Additional work needed to replace valves, gates, and weirs damaged by fire and storms prior to installing gaging.
